**Subject:** Resource Allocation and Enhancement for Colorado Counter-Terrorism Operations

Given the current elevated threat level (Orange) in Colorado and the potential for domestic incidents involving non-state actors, optimizing the equipment of response teams is paramount. This involves supporting both the National Guard and FBI elements on the ground, as well as considering the unique requirements of Task Force Vanguard (TFV).

I propose initiating contact with TFV liaison officers and the appropriate FBI SWAT team commanders/handlers. The objective is to gauge their immediate equipment needs, particularly in terms of enhanced defensive gear. I am exploring the possibility of allocating advanced ceramic plate carriers and/or modern submachine guns, subject to availability and interagency coordination.

Leveraging the after-action reports and intelligence gathered from last year's neutralized paramilitary threat offers valuable insight into potential adversary capabilities. To further strengthen my justification for resource allocation, I request that both FBI and TFV prioritize submitting detailed reports on encountered hostile weaponry and armor. This data is crucial for demonstrating the need for upgraded equipment, specifically the potential requirement for DoD-issue rifle plates for FBI teams. The presence of sophisticated enemy weaponry necessitates ensuring federal agents are adequately equipped to mitigate the risk of being outgunned during counter-terrorism operations.

Positive responses to these requests, coupled with comprehensive equipment assessments, will enable me to effectively advocate for the provision of plate carriers to FBI teams, with a sufficient surplus to accommodate TFV requirements. This proactive approach strengthens interagency collaboration, enhances the operational readiness of key response units, and positions myself as a valuable partner in mitigating the current threat environment. Furthermore, this demonstrates my commitment to supporting TFV, potentially fostering a stronger working relationship for future collaborations.

**Type:** Equipment Transfer

**Origin:** Dept of Defense

**Recipient:** FBI and TFV teams in Denver, Colorado

**>Equipment Transfer form**

**Type of Equipment:** New Generation Plate carriers and Rifle Plates

**Estimated quantities:** See attached note on FBI SWAT teams deployed in area, alongside a 30%

surplus TFV teams will be notified and have opportunity to resupply and take from stock.

Location: Denver, Colorado

Reason for transfer:

- See attached preliminary FBI and TFV report on equipment used by attackers.
- High likelihood of FBI/TFV raids on discovered hotspots.
- High likelihood of hostiles using equal or superior equipment to what was used in the attacks, in greater numbers and from fortified positions.
- See attached pre-filled equipment Transfer Acceptance Form to FBI Logistical Coordinator in charge of Denver.
- See map of Denver with possible delivery routes within the city according to unrest heatmap.

Side note: Opportunity for valuable feedback on efficiency and use in urban combat scenarios

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>Action 2:

Type: Equipment Transfer

Origin: Dept of Defense

Recipient: National Guard Units in Denver, Colorado

>Equipment Transfer form

Type of Equipment: Kevlar vests and helmets

Estimated quantities: See attached note on National Guard deployed in area. Quantities should be sufficient to outfit all street-side patrols, plus 10%.

Location: Denver, Colorado

Reason for transfer:

- See attached preliminary FBI and TFV report on equipment used by attackers.
- Local public order unstable means NG units will likely be ordered to patrol instead of staying in place.
- As a result, they present easier targets for attack, either by insurgents or opportunists and would benefit from added protection when out on patrol.
- See attached pre-filled equipment Transfer Acceptance Form, and a list of armorers and quartermasters attached to NG units deployed or deploying to Denver.
- See map of Denver with possible delivery routes within the city according to unrest heatmap.

Side note: Extra kick to confidence of NG units. In case of engagement, any losses will be difficult to hide and prevent from further harming local public order and emboldening local interest groups into anti-government action.
